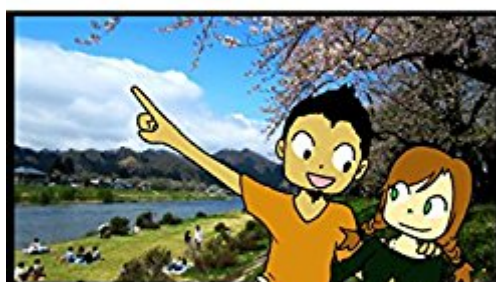

I read Grace's blog and have watched many of her YouTube videos, so I was very interested in reading this comic book. My Life in Japan is a cute collection of comics based on the author's life. Grace is originally from Texas, and her husband, Ryosuke, is from Japan; the two met while in college in Pennsylvania, and now live in the Japanese countryside. Through her comic books, blog, and YouTube channel, Grace talks about her experiences in Japan - discussing culture, relationships, food, work, and everyday activities. The book is full funny and sweet moments from Grace and Ryosuke's lives, often relating to Grace's experiences as a white American woman living in Japan. In one comic, Grace overhears two children commenting that she doesn't look like a human; but as the children continue talking, they go on to say that she

doesn't look like a human because she's so pretty â€” like a real, living doll! The comics are well-illustrated and witty, and Grace's drawing style is captivating. A strong component of Grace's storytelling is that the comics are nicely paced, moving the story along at a skillfully crafted speed. I really enjoyed the book.

I'm not Japanese, but my siblings are half, I grew up there, and in mixed family. I also grew up in Texas. These stories are completely relatable to anyone who has lived in Japan for even a few months. As a Texan, I feel like I have a little more insight as well. Really though, many things are just applicable to anyone with a close relationship with someone who doesn't have the same primary language as you.

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
